INTRODUCTION

This past year, our dojo was once again full of life. We trained intensively, traveled to seminars with inspiring teachers, and met with friends — on the tatami and beyond.

Children, youth, and adults of all levels gathered on the tatami week after week. And we continue to grow; young aikidoka who once started in our youth groups are now leading their own training sessions or even running children's classes. Beginners in sweatpants turn into advanced students in hakama, and advanced students earn their black belts. Life in the dojo is diverse, friendly, dynamic, and inspiring — and we truly enjoy it.

We started an international publishing activity on the Substack platform in 2024. Under the title *Aikido: Art for Life*, we've been sharing weekly articles exploring the principles and teachings of Aikido. Just six months after its launch, the newsletter has attracted thousands of readers from around the world.

Thank you to everyone who is part of this journey. On the following pages, you'll find more detailed insights into our activities.















AIKIDO PRAGUE VINOHRADY

Since its establishment in 2007, Aikido Prague Vinohrady, z. s. has been supporting and developing Aikido — a physical, mental, and spiritual discipline created by Morihei Ueshiba, based on various traditional Japanese martial arts and his own spiritual insights.

The club introduces Aikido to the public as a tool for comprehensive development:

- » It organizes and provides regular training sessions and further education in the form of seminars and workshops.
- » It organizes and provides instructions in disciplines related to Aikido, particularly those that extend beyond the physical framework and fulfill broader educational goals.
- » It creates educational materials for its activities.
- » It collaborates with individuals and organizations in the Czech Republic and worldwide that have similar goals, and focus on promoting Aikido and related disciplines.

Our main activity is the teaching of the Japanese martial art Aikido to children, youth, and adults through regular training sessions.

In addition to regular training, we organize weekend Aikido seminars and week-long summer schools. Together, we attend seminars outside Prague and abroad (mainly Slovakia, Germany, Sweden, France, and Japan) and organize many other activities for club members: outdoor trips, cultural, social, and educational events. We raise awareness about Aikido through public demonstrations, sample classes, and promotional materials.

Currently, 13 teachers and 10 assistants lead training sessions in the club. Assistants from the youth category primarily help with children's training – in this way, we gradually train future candidates for teachers within the club. Teachers expand their qualifications through regular teacher training and other events.

Aikido Prague Vinohrady is a registered association and a member of the Czech Federation of Aikido, which is recognized by the central world Aikido headquarters, Aikikai Hombu Dojo in Tokyo.





OUR AIKIDO YEAR 2024

Number of Practitioners

Throughout the year 2024, approximately 280 people trained at the club — around 170 adults (17+), 80 children (5–12 years old) and 30 youths (13–17 years old). Both men and women practice Aikido with us, ranging from preschoolers to seniors.

Regular Training for Adults

In 2024, the training for adults was conducted in the range of 11 hours a week. One training session a week was dedicated to those at a higher technical level, 4th kyu and above. The other training sessions, including regular weapon training, were open to all members regardless of their level of proficiency. Members from the youth group could also participate in these sessions, helping to bridge generational gaps. The training took place at Sokol Královské Vinohrady (Polská 1, Prague 2) and at Prostoru 8 (Šmilovského 8, Prague 2).

During the summer holidays, a shortened version of this schedule was followed: 5 hours weekly on the tatami and 1 hour of outdoor weapon training.





The training was conducted primarily by the club's teachers: Martin Švihla, Vanda Švihlová, Michal Roder, Jacques Joseph, Milada Bouzidi, Matouš Janů a Martin Gorčák, with a few exceptions.

Aikido is amazing, and I really like how complex it is — it's not just about mastering some techniques. You learn to be aware of your own body, but also to sense the other person's body you're practicing with, because the goal is to train without getting hurt. The atmosphere is

really friendly and we help each other out. Like, if I'm struggling with something, there's always someone happy to give advice and tell me what I could improve or focus on more. =)

Fundamentals Aikido Course

In 2024, we conducted 5 sessions of our threemonth Fundamentals Aikido Course, aimed at providing complete beginners with a comprehensive foundation in Aikido. In this course, newcomers learn basic falls, steps, and techniques, and also work with the sword.

There was a new teacher for the Fundamentals Aikido Course in 2024. Apart from Martin Švihla, Matouš Janů also started to lead the course. It gives participants the opportunity to experience two different styles of teaching and therefore, get a richer experience.

Aikido for Children and Youth

In the 2024/2025 school year, we ran 8 Aikido groups for children and youth, totaling 13 hours of training per week. These sessions were divided into five age categories: three groups of the youngest children (5-7 years), two groups of younger pupils (8-10 years), one group of older pupils (10-13 years), and two groups of teenagers (13-15 and 15-17 years). Approximately 110 club members train in these groups. The children's training sessions were led by Martin Švihla, Pavel Linhart, Eliška Pažitná, Milada Bouzidi, Jan Macháček, Klára Gregová, Anna Prokešová and Tatsuya Štemberk, along with their assistants from the youth ranks. Over the course of the year, Jan Florian, Tereza Kozická, Vítek Kománek, and Lenka Honzáková gradually began taking on independent teaching roles in our children's and youth groups.

We also organized large and small seminars, trips, camps, dojo sleepovers, or voluntary work in nature for children and youth — some of which you will learn more about further in the report.

Teacher Development

We're especially delighted by the new generation of young aikidoka who started with us in youth groups, later supported classes as assistants, and are now gradually taking on full responsibility for leading training sessions and entire groups. In the 2024/2025 school year, our team of children's and youth teachers was joined by Jan Florian, Tereza Kozická, Vítek Kománek, and Lenka Honzáková. It's inspiring to watch them grow; not only in their technical skills, but also personally and as teachers.

Throughout 2024, our club's teachers and assistants regularly met for team meetings and special training sessions dedicated to teaching development. These gatherings serve as a space to share new ideas, enhance teaching skills and competencies, maintain connection between different groups, and strengthen the sense of community among our teaching team.

We also continue to take part in regular teacher training events organized by the Czech Federation of Aikido. These events give teachers the opportunity to exchange experiences across different clubs throughout the Czech Republic.

Black and White Belts

In 2024, several advanced club members achieved higher technical ranks from the Aikikai, the global aikido headquarters: Iveta Antošová 1st dan, Anton Pavlov 1st dan, Jan Macháček 2nd dan, Dmytro Hejko 2nd dan.

A total of 38 successful kyu rank gradings were conducted.

140 Children and 40 Adults on One Tatami: International Seminar for Children and Youth

For the fourth time, we hosted the international seminar Aiki4Kids in Vinohrady. The event brought together 140 children and teens, 40 adults, and participants from 20 clubs and 7 countries. We laid out 700 square meters of tatami for seven training sessions; some split into three age groups, others open to everyone, including parents. The event concluded with a special Aikido demonstration.

Words can't truly capture the atmosphere: the collective energy, teenagers committed to dynamic practice, young children gently exploring touch or engaging in playful wrestling. Our young aikidoka formed an excellent organizational team, ensuring everything ran smoothly. So many things happened that Saturday — each one a story in itself.

Seminars Led by our Teachers

Publications, Public Demonstrations, and Media

In 2024, we launched a new international project on the Substack platform. Under the title *Aikido*: *Art for Life*, we publish a new article every Thursday, covering topics such as Aikido teaching, working with children and youth, Aikido principles, and dojo life. Why in English? Our aim is to create a space for sharing ideas and experiences across the international Aikido community. After just six months, the newsletter is proving its value — with each article reaching between 500 and 1,000 readers from around the world.

We also continued our publishing activities in 2024. We completed a beautiful beginner's guide, contributed a series of Aikido articles to the magazine Bojová umění, and continued our translation work on Franck Noël's texts. We're delighted to be sharing Aikido not only on the tatami but

also through writing — reaching a wider audience who resonate with our path.

As tradition has it, we once again prepared an Aikido demonstration for the Akimatsuri, the Japanese autumn festival. The festival is full of Japanese culture and cuisine. We love it — and we wouldn't miss it for the world.

We also regularly take part in the Sports Festival for Prague 2, organized by the Prague 2 Municipal District. In 2024, Martin and Tačan led four mini training sessions for children aged six to thirteen — all within three hours. They even became the stars of a news report covering the whole event. 

CLUB TEACHERS



Ing. Martin Švihla, PhD. 5th dan Aikikai, 1st class trainer
